

# Suggested Replacement Trees for Myoporum

The following list includes selections that are known to tolerate wind, poor soil, and low water (once established). It is suggested that any new tree be watered regularly for the first year or two to establish a healthy root structure!

<i>Ceanothus - 'Ray Hartman'</i>	California Lilac
<i>Corynocarpus laevigatus</i>	New Zealand Laurel
<i>Cupaniopsis anacardioides</i>	Carrot Wood
<i>Geijera parviflora</i>	Australian Willow
<i>Heteromeles arbutifolia</i>	Toyon
<i>Laurus 'Saratoga'</i>	Saratoga Bay Laurel
<i>Leptospermum laevigatum</i>	Australian Tea Tree
<i>Lyonothamnus floribundus</i>	Catalina Ironwood
<i>Melaleuca ericifolia</i>	Heath Melaleuca
<i>Melaleuca linariifolia</i>	Flaxleaf Paperbark
<i>Melaleuca styphelioides</i>	Black Tea Tree
<i>Melaleuca quinquenervia</i>	Cajeput Tree
<i>Pittosporum crassifolium</i>	Karo Tree
<i>Rhus lancea</i>	African sumac
<i>Tristania conferta</i>	Brisbane Box
<i>Tristaniopsis laurina 'Elegant'</i>	Small-Leaf Tristania
<i>Quercus agrifolia</i>	Coast Live Oak
